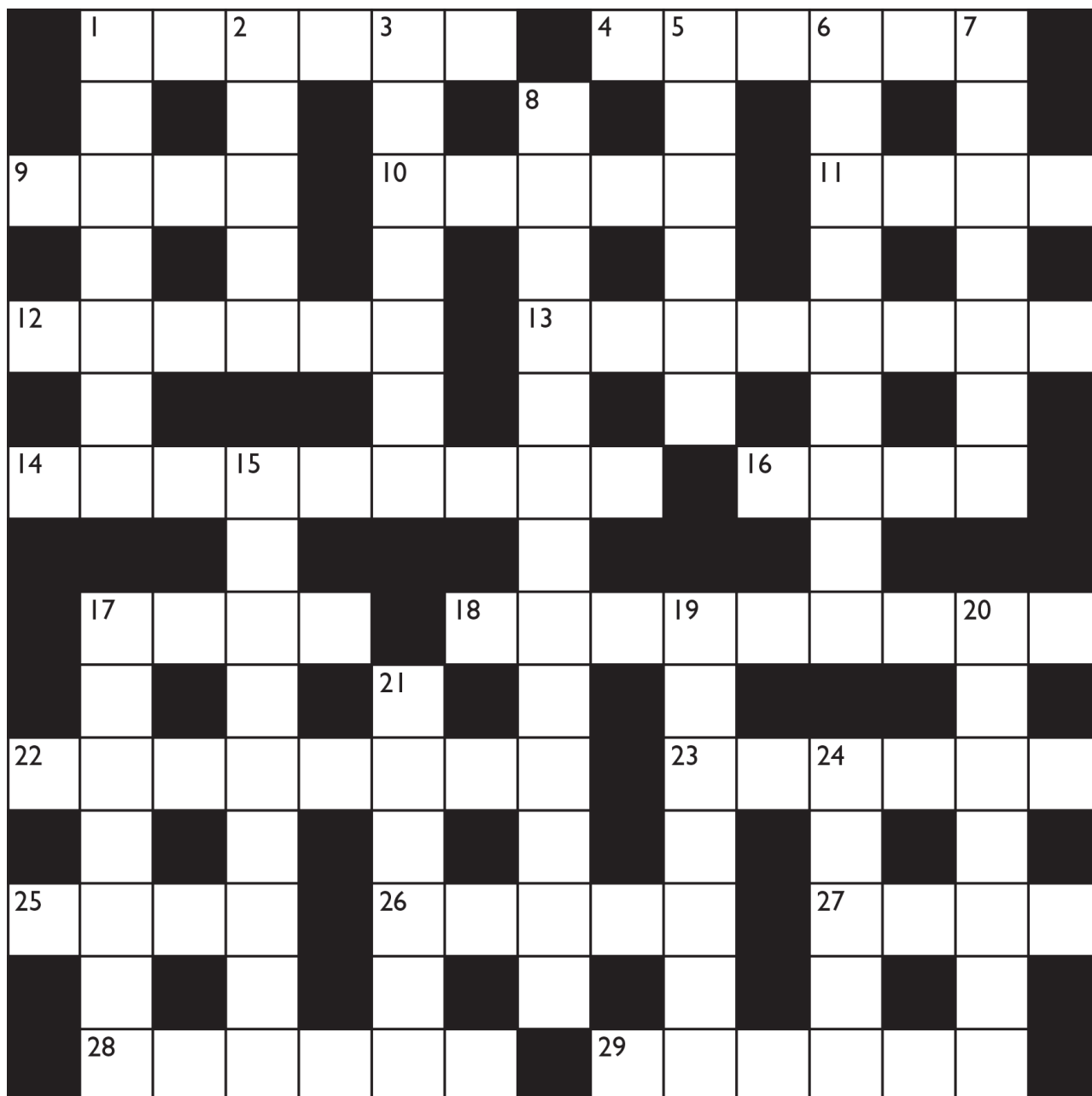


Geographical Crossword June 2025
